

## **APS Supported Programs:**

- <u>New Century Scholars Resident Mentoring Program (NCS)</u> aimed at increasing the diversity of the academic pediatric workforce.
- <u>Pediatric Scientist Development Program (PSDP)</u> provides intensive training in research relevant to specialty areas of pediatrics. The goal is to prepare entry-level faculty for research careers in academic pediatrics.
- <u>Research in Academic Pediatrics Initiative on Diversity (RAPID)</u> targets young scholars (residents, fellows, and junior faculty) who identify as underrepresented in medicine (UIM), disabled, or from a socially, culturally, economically, or educationally disadvantaged background.
