Personal Interest Statement for an American Pediatric Society Council Position:

My career demonstrates that academic physicians can be both world-class scientists and impactful, evidence-based advocates for child health and safety. I discovered novel injury mechanisms and their countermeasures and led diverse groups that advanced regulations. laws, programs and products that reduced crashes (by 30%), saved thousands of lives and enhanced recovery from traffic injury. I will bring this experience to my role on APS Council by guiding strategic priorities for future programs that mentor and train leaders in pediatric academic entrepreneurship and advocacy. I believe that it is crucial for pediatricians to be prepared to innovate and translate these innovations into new devices and treatments will be both acceptable and effective. In my career, I was that pediatrician at the table - addressing the leading cause of death in children. Rigorous science was my starting point but partnership allowed my discoveries to be realized into life-saving technology. My background in medicine, engineering, and public health allowed me to conduct research at the interface of child and adolescent health, injury, technology, and behavior while also spanning the academicgovernment-industry boundary, building and leading effective multi-stakeholder healthcare and prevention teams. My "research-to-action-to-impact" approach to academic entrepreneurship has led to new patents, products, programs, policies, and laws, as well as a spin-out technology company called Diagnostic Driving, Inc. In order to share this expertise with the new movement in academic clinical entrepreneurs, I released a free e-textbook, Academic Entrepreneurship for Medical and Health Scientists (http://repository.upenn.edu/ace/) and an associated online community (https://academicentrepreneurship.pubpub.org/), which has exceeded 43,000 downloads from 154 countries and 2612 institutions, including 111 government agencies.
