The Department of Pediatrics at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai (ISMMS), Mount Sinai Kravis Children's Hospital, and the Institute for Critical Care Medicine are seeking a System Chief for its Division of Pediatric Critical Care. The candidate must be board certified in Pediatric Critical Care, with additional board eligibility/certification in Pediatric Cardiology desirable. S/he must be committed to excellence and strategic growth in clinical care and quality improvement, education, research/scholarship, and diversity and inclusion.

A strong academic background with a record of achievement in clinical science, health services, or quality improvement is highly desirable. Candidates must show evidence of a track record in leadership, collaboration with partners in the hospital and School of Medicine, mentorship and with strong administrative and interpersonal skills.

The clinical home for the Division of Pediatric Critical Care is the 15-bed Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) and the 6-bed Pediatric Cardiac Intensive Critical Care Unit (PCICU) in the Kravis Children's Hospital, located on 5th Avenue on the Upper East Side of Manhattan. These two inpatient units serve the entire MSHS, admitting over 1100 patients per year and accepting medical and surgical transfers from hospitals in all NYC boroughs and beyond in New York State, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

The Division of Pediatric Critical Care is also part of the Institute for Critical Care Medicine at Mount Sinai Health System (ICCM): a Critical Care Organization that aligns clinical programs, treatment protocols, resources and patient safety and quality initiatives across the 21 ICUs in the Health System.

The Divisional faculty, including 10 BC/BE intensivists (2 of whom are BC/BE in pediatric critical care medicine and pediatric cardiology, 1 with additional training in cardiac intensive care), supported by a multidisciplinary team of critical care nurses, respiratory therapists, social workers, child life specialists and pharmacists, provide 24/7 multidisciplinary coverage. The units offer state-of-the-art services including:

- ACGME accredited fellowship in pediatric critical care medicine with 24/7 fellow clinical coverage
- Extracorporeal Life Support (ECLS) 24/7 including ECLS CPR
- All modalities of mechanical circulatory support including but not limited to VA/VV ECMO, IABPs, EXCOR Pediatric (Berlin Heart), Centrimag/Pedimag VADs, and Heartmate 3
- In situ simulation program
- On-unit clinical pharmacist support
- Robust neonatal and pediatric cardiac surgical program including surgical management of patients born with single ventricles.
- Support for all modalities of renal replacement therapy including the CarpeDiem system
- All available modalities of mechanical ventilation

- Support for solid organ transplantation programs in liver, kidney, small bowel and heart
- Support for an internationally recognized genetic and metabolic disease program
- Support for a growing pediatric oncology program
- Post-return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) Arctic Sun thermoregulation neuroprotection system
- Advanced airway and thoracic surgery (i.e. slide tracheoplasty and reconstruction)
- Extensive involvement in national/international QI and research multicenter databases and consortiums

- Clinical informatics support
- International leaders in EP and interventional cardiac catheterization
