

Ravit Boger, MD Professor of Pediatrics, Microbiology, and Immunology Chief, Pediatrics Infectious Diseases Medical College of Wisconsin

Dr. Boger is nationally and internationally recognized for her clinical, translational, and basic studies of human cytomegalovirus. She completed her medical degree from Tel-Aviv university and her pediatrics residency at Dana Children's Hospital (Tel-Aviv, Israel). She then completed a fellowship in Pediatric Infectious Diseases at the Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions. She joined the faculty at Johns Hopkins and rose through the ranks to full professor. She was an attending physician at Johns Hopkins and has led a laboratory for cytomegalovirus research. She has been an active member of the collaborative antiviral study group. Dr. Boger was recruited to the Medical College of Wisconsin and Children's Wisconsin in 2018 as Chief of Pediatric Infectious Diseases. She has been active in building the Infectious Diseases service and mentoring junior faculty. Her laboratory continues to study human cytomegalovirus. Major areas of research include virus-host interactions and antiviral drug development. She has received grant support from the NIH and pharmaceutical companies.
