Sara DeMauro, MD, MSCE, is an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Pennsylvania Perelman School of Medicine, Program Director for Neonatal Follow-up, Associate Director for Neonatal Clinical and Epidemiological Research, and attending neonatologist in the Division of Neonatology at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She is also appointed as Associate Scholar in the University of Pennsylvania Center for Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics, where she obtained her master's degree in clinical epidemiology with a focus in clinical trials. Sara is a neonatologist, epidemiologist and physician scientist who conducts research focused on how neonatal interventions and exposures influence children's medical and neurodevelopmental trajectories. Her specific areas of research focus have included the medical and developmental outcomes of infants with bronchopulmonary dysplasia (BPD), early school age functioning of high-risk preterm infants, and research related to the conduct of high quality longitudinal neonatal clinical research and multidisciplinary follow-up. Sara is Principal Investigator for the Penn/CHOP Clinical Center of the *Eunice Kennedy Shriver* NICHD Neonatal Research Network (NRN) and also has funding from NICHD, NHLBI, NIDA, AHRQ, and private foundations to support her research.
