

Kenya McNeal-Trice, MD Associate Professor Director, Pediatric Residency Program University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Medicine

Dr. Kenya McNeal-Trice is an associate professor of pediatrics at UNC and director of the Pediatrics Residency Program. Dr. McNeal-Trice received a BS in Biology from Spelman College before entering medical school at Wayne State University. She completed pediatric residency training at UNC and then was Pediatric Chief Resident at WakeMed. In 2007, Dr. McNeal-Trice returned to Chapel Hill to take on a leadership role in medical student education as a member of the Division of General Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine. In 2010, she assumed the role of Director of Medical Student Education in Pediatrics. As a student educator, Dr. McNeal-Trice is an innovator, creating the nationally recognized and award-winning Transition to Pediatrics Internship course; an outstanding teacher, receiving the The Hyman L. Battle Distinguished Excellence in Teaching Award in the Clinical Sciences from the UNC SOM Class of 2013; and a tremendous student advocate, serving in the Larry Keith Advisory College. Her clinical work has focused on inpatient pediatrics and child maltreatment. Dr. McNeal-Trice notes that throughout her educational and professional careers, countless individuals have made critical investments in her development: her mom, her high school chemistry teacher, her Spelman College and Wayne State University medical school professors, and her UNC School of Medicine Department of Pediatrics colleagues, among many others.
