

Douglas J. Opel, MD, MPH Professor of Pediatrics University of Washington School of Medicine

Douglas J. Opel, MD, MPH, is a Professor in the Department of Pediatrics and Adjunct Professor in the Department of Bioethics and Humanities at the University of Washington School of Medicine. He is also Interim Director of the Treuman Katz Center for Pediatric Bioethics at Seattle Children's Research Institute. He practices as a general pediatrician at the University of Washington Medical Center.

Dr. Opel has been continuously funded by the NIH since 2010 to identify effective vaccine communication strategies for use with parents. He has also received funding from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality and the Greenwall Foundation as a Faculty Scholar in Bioethics to improve implementation of shared decision-making in pediatrics. His research interests include provider-parent communication, medical decision-making, and public health ethics, with a primary goal of his research to improve child health by optimizing pediatric decision-making and the provider-parent relationship. Dr. Opel has published articles on pediatric and bioethical issues in major journals, including *New England Journal of Medicine, Health Affairs, American Journal of Public Health, British Medical Journal, Lancet* and Hastings Center Report.
