Dr. Kelly Wade is currently Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at the Perelman School of Medicine, University of Pennsylvania, and Associate Director of Therapeutics and Education at the Pennsylvania Hospital Newborn Intensive Care Unit, a 50 bed Level 3 Unit staffed by the CHOP Division of Neonatology. She completed her MD PhD at Yale, Pediatric Residency in the Boston Combined Residency Program, and Neonatal Perinatal Medicine fellowship at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Dr. Wade has built a career in neonatal clinical pharmacology with involvement in both research through the Pediatric Trials Network and clinical leadership in key FDA, AAP, and ASHP committees involved with safe use of therapeutics for young children. She leads the University of Pennsylvania Health System Neonatal Pharmacy and Therapeutics Subcommittee, a multidisciplinary committee standardizing medication practices across 5 Newborn ICUs. As an active member of the Critical Path Institute International Neonatal Consortium, she is involved with clinical pharmacology, adverse event monitoring, and multi-stakeholder research communication. Through research, education, and advocacy she aims to improve drug safety in young infants.
