The Department of Pediatrics, Yale School of Medicine is recruiting a Chief of Neurology to lead a group of faculty members in our mission of delivering the highest quality care to patients and their families at Yale-New Haven Children's Hospital. The new Chief will be responsible for sustaining and expanding robust programs in clinical care, research, education and quality improvement. The candidate should have a record of leadership in the development of clinical services and expertise in the management of infants and children with neurological disorders. In addition, well-qualified candidates should have demonstrated excellence in educational contributions, scholarly accomplishments and mentoring faculty and trainees. The successful candidate will have a dynamic personality, outstanding communication and interpersonal skills and a demonstrated commitment to a culture of diversity, inclusion and collaboration. A track record of scholarship is required. The full-time academic appointment for this position will be at the Associate Professor or Professor level at the Yale School of Medicine in either the Clinician-Educator/Scholar, Clinician-Scientist or Traditional Track, depending on the applicant's qualifications.

Applicants should be Board Certified or Board Eligible in Pediatrics-Neurology and/or Pediatrics-Neurodevelopmental Disabilities and qualified for an appointment to the faculty at Yale School of Medicine.

- Recruit and retain physicians and cultivate existing and new programs of neurology
- Responsible for the implementation of departmental activities to assure the delivery of clinical services in a manner consistent with the needs of the patients and the hospital.
- Assure compliance with the YNHCH medical staff by-laws.
- Maintain effective liaison with the Chair and Vice Chairs of Pediatrics at the Yale School of Medicine.
- Ensure that members of the Section of Neurology are active participants in advancing the overarching standards and initiatives of YNHCH.
- Lead Section Faculty Meetings and participate in Departmental Leadership Meetings

Research & Scholarly Activities (variable)

- Dedicate time to an area of academic interest which will advance the career of the new Section Chief and also enrich the stature and expertise of the Department of Pediatrics
- Produce peer-reviewed scholarly works that are published and widely disseminated
- Maintain or develop an independently-funded research program (if on the Clinician-Scientist or Traditional Track).

- Be a visible and significant participant in the direct teaching of medical students, pediatric residents, and Child Neurology residents in a clinical setting.
