Dr. Katherine Dell is a physician-scientist and pediatric nephrologist who is a nationally and internationally recognized expert in pediatric cystic kidney diseases. She received her medical degree from Harvard Medical School and completed pediatric residency and pediatric nephrology fellowship at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She is Professor of Pediatrics at Case Western Reserve University and currently serves as the Director of Clinical and Translational Research for the Children's Institute at Cleveland Clinic.

Her clinical and translational research focuses on the development and application of novel quantitative magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) techniques as biomarkers for pediatric chronic kidney diseases, specifically, autosomal recessive polycystic kidney disease (ARPKD) and autosomal dominant polycystic kidney disease (ADPKD). She is also active in several collaborative research studies in CKD and nephrotic syndrome and has participated in multiple clinical trials of therapeutic agents for pediatric CKD.
