Angela Ellison, MD, MSc, is the Vice Chair of the Department of Pediatrics and an attending physician in the Division of Emergency Medicine at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP). She holds the Louis Starr Endowed Chair in Pediatrics at CHOP and was recently promoted to Professor of Pediatrics at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Ellison's research portfolio is focused on hematologic emergencies (sickle cell disease and thrombosis) and advancing health equity. She has served as the Principal Investigator or a collaborator on multiple NIH funded studies directed at improving the acute management of complications of sickle cell disease in the emergency department and the inpatient setting. She is currently the co-PI of the NHLBI funded multi-center Bedside Exclusion of Pulmonary Embolism without Radiation (BEEPER) study, the only prospective study of pulmonary embolism in children to date. Dr. Ellison has a long track record as a champion for diversity and fostering the academic careers of those who are underrepresented in medicine and biomedical sciences, locally and nationally. She was recently elected to the At-Large seat representing medical subspecialties on the American Academy of Pediatrics Board of Directors. Dr. Ellison is a member of the Editorial Board for Pediatric Emergency Care and is an Associate Editor for Academic Emergency Medicine. She is a proud graduate of the Hedwig van Ameringen Executive Leadership in Academic Medicine (ELAM) Program at Drexel University.
