Professor and Chief, Division of General Pediatrics University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, School of Medicine

Dr. Kori Flower is a pediatrician, Professor of General Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, and Chief of the Division of General Pediatrics at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Over approximately 20 years, she has led research and quality improvement interventions focused on improving the quality of pediatric primary care and reducing health care disparities for children, specifically for Spanish-speaking families. She served as site Principal Investigator for the original Greenlight study and serves as one of the Principal Investigators for the current PCORI-funded Greenlight Plus study. Her publications also describe the work she has led to improve preventive services in pediatric practices nationally through quality improvement collaboratives to improve early childhood screenings. Dr. Flower has received funding from federal agencies, including NIH, CDC, HRSA, and CMS, as well as multiple foundations and the American Academy of Pediatrics, to support her work addressing healthcare disparities for young children.

Dr. Flower completed her B.S. degree at Cornell University, her MS degree at the University of California at Berkeley, her MD degree at the University of California at San Francisco, and her MPH degree at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She completed her Pediatric Residency at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where she was also a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar and completed a 2-year research fellowship.
