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Sara Johnson, PhD, MPH, is Blanket Fort Foundation Professor in Pediatric Population Health and Health Equity Research at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. She also holds joint appointments at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Her research focuses on understanding the biological and social mechanisms that perpetuate health inequality across the life course and generations. As Director of the Rales Center for the Integration of Health and Education, Dr. Johnson works with a multidisciplinary team of researchers, educators, and clinicians to translate her mechanistic and developmental research into innovative school-based health programs to support children's long-term health and academic success. For the last 13 years, she has directed the Johns Hopkins General Academic Pediatrics Fellowship program, which helps to train the next generation of clinician-scientists for careers in pediatric research. She received her master's and doctoral degrees in public health from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and was a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Health and Society Scholar at UCSF and UC Berkeley before joining the faculty at Johns Hopkins.
