Dr. Rachel Katzenellenbogen studied Chemistry and graduated magna cum laude from Harvard University (1994). She completed medical school and a Howard Hughes Medical Institute Medical Student Research Fellow at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine (1999). She trained in pediatrics (2002), adolescent medicine (2005), and STD research (2006) at the University of Washington. In 2006, she joined the faculty at the University of Washington School of Medicine and was promoted to associate professor (2015). In 2018, Dr. Katzenellenbogen joined the faculty at Indiana University School of Medicine. She currently is the Richard E. and Pauline P. Klingler Professor of Pediatrics and a Professor of Microbiology and Immunology. She conducts domestic and international research on human papillomavirus (HPV) and how HPV initiates and drives cancer development and progression in people. At Indiana University, she is a faculty member in the Morris Green Physician Scientist Development Program in the Department of Pediatrics. She also is the program leader for the Indiana University Leadership Education in Adolescent Health training grant funded by HRSA. Dr. Katzenellenbogen is chief of the Adolescent Medicine division, co-director of the Center for HPV Research at Indiana University, and co-leader of the Cancer Prevention and Control program at Indiana University Simon Comprehensive Cancer Center.
