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Esi M. Morgan, MD, MSCE, is Professor of Pediatrics, University of Washington, and Head of the Division of Rheumatology at Seattle Children's Hospital. She is a clinical researcher with specialization in quality improvement methods, study of observational and EHR data for comparative effectiveness of therapeutics, and expertise in patient reported outcomes (PRO) measure development and implementation in clinical care. Dr. Morgan leads the Pediatric Rheumatology Care and Outcomes Improvement Network (www.pr-coin.org), a multi-hospital (23) learning health network that leverages a shared registry to apply QI and implementation science to improve the outcomes of care of children with rheumatic disease, and to bring research findings to care faster. Dr. Morgan participated in development and conducted validation studies of Patient Reported Outcomes Measurement Information System (PROMIS) PROs including domains of pain and physical function. Dr. Morgan Co-Chairs the International Outcome Measures in Rheumatology (OMERACT) JIA Working Group.

Dr. Morgan completed her education at Harvard University, Washington University School of Medicine, University of Pennsylvania, and her residency and fellowship training at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She has over 90 publications (peer-reviewed manuscripts, invited papers, book chapters), plus numerous abstracts/posters/presentations at professional meetings. She has received funding from NIH, PCORI, AHRQ, CCRF, Arthritis Foundation, and Pfizer Foundation.
