

Sarah N. Taylor, MD, MSCR Professor of Pediatrics Yale School of Medicine

Dr. Sarah Taylor is Professor of Pediatrics in the Yale School of Medicine and Professor of Chronic Disease Epidemiology in the Yale School of Public Health. She is the Yale Chief of Neonatal Perinatal Medicine and directs neonatal clinical research. Her NIH and foundation-funded research awards led to development of the Yale Neonatal NOuRish program. This research program includes clinical and translational investigations of how pregnancy, lactation and other postnatal nutritional and metabolic exposures impact infant and maternal outcomes. In addition to her research, Dr. Taylor is an advocate for mother and infant nutrition at the international, national, and local levels. On the state level, while on faculty at the Medical University of South Carolina in 2015, she started the Mother's Milk Bank of South Carolina, and she continues her involvement in milk banking through membership on the executive board of the Human Milk Banking Association of North America.
