

## Alan M. Delamater, PhD

Professor of Pediatrics and Psychology and Director of Clinical Psychology Department of Pediatrics University of Miami Miller School of Medicine

Alan M. Delamater received his PhD in clinical psychology from the University of Georgia in 1981. He is Professor of Pediatrics and Psychology and Director of Clinical Psychology in the Department of Pediatrics, and Director of Research in the Mailman Center for Child Development at the University of Miami, where he has been since 1991. He was previously on the faculty at Washington University and Wayne State University. Dr. Delamater has received many research grants from the NIH, has served on many NIH grant review panels, and has published widely in the field of pediatric psychology and behavioral medicine, focusing on health disparities and the role of psychosocial and behavioral factors in diabetes. He has served in leadership roles with several professional organizations, including the American Psychological Association (APA), the American Diabetes Association (ADA), the International Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Diabetes (ISPAD), and the Society of Behavioral Medicine (SBM). Dr. Delamater is a Fellow of the APA and SBM. He was on the ISPAD Advisory Council from 2006-2008 and served as the ISPAD conference president in 2011. He has received several awards from the SBM, including the LifeScan Diabetes Research Award (1997 and 1999), the Outstanding Contributions to Research Award from the Child and Family Special Interest Group (2012), the C. Tracy Orleans Distinguished Service Award (2016), the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Child and Family Special Interest Group (2017), and the Distinguished Mentor Award (2019). In 2022, he received the Richard R. Rubin Award for Behavioral Diabetes Research by the ADA. Dr. Delamater is active as a teacher and clinician and is board-certified in clinical health psychology.
