Professor of Pediatrics Pulmonary, Allergy/Immunology, and Sleep Medicine Vice Chair for Clinical Research, Department of Pediatrics Indiana University School of Medicine Riley Hospital for Children

Dr. Erick Forno is a Pediatric Pulmonologist and Vice-Chair for Clinical Research in the Department of Pediatrics at Indiana University School of Medicine and Riley Children's Hospital. Dr Forno completed his medical school at Cayetano Heredia University in Perú, residency at Children's Hospital Denver, fellowship at Boston Children's Hospital, and an MPH at the Harvard School of Public Health. After working at the University of Miami (2009-2012), he joined the University of Pittsburgh (2012-2023), where he was promoted to associate professor. In 2023, he joined the faculty at Indiana University School of Medicine as tenured professor of Pediatrics.

Dr. Forno's career has focused on excellence in research, innovation, education, and clinical care. His overarching research interests include the epidemiology and genomics of asthma; the effects of obesity on childhood respiratory health; leveraging "omics" approaches to identify predictive and response biomarkers in pediatric pulmonary diseases; and the use of technology to improve respiratory health for children.

Dr. Forno has served in several NIH grant study sections and is currently standing member in the Cardiovascular and Respiratory Disease (CRD) section. He has also held numerous roles in the American Thoracic Society (ATS), including vice-chair of the Scientific Advisory Committee, chair of the Program and Planning Committees in the Pediatrics Assembly, and the executive committee for the Section on Genetics and Genomics. He has authored or co-authored over 220 peer-reviewed publications to date and is funded by grants from the US National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the US National Science Foundation (NSF).
