Jessica Kahn, MD, MPH, is a tenured Professor of Pediatrics and Senior Associate Dean of Clinical and Translational Research at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, and serves as Director of the Block Institute for Clinical and Translational Research. She was previously a tenured Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine and was a faculty member at Cincinnati Children's for 25 years. She served as the Associate Chair of Academic Affairs and Career Development and as the Rauh Chair and Director of the Division of Adolescent and Transition Medicine at Cincinnati Children's, and as the PI of the KL2 Scholars Program and MPI of the Center for Clinical and Translational Science and Training, the University of Cincinnati's Clinical and Translational Science Award. She received her MD from Harvard Medical School and MPH from the Harvard School of Public Health, and she completed a residency in Pediatrics and fellowship in Adolescent Medicine at Boston Children's Hospital. She practiced adolescent medicine for more than 20 years, with a focus on young women's health. She is a clinical investigator whose long-term research objective is to reduce morbidity and mortality due to cervical cancer and other diseases related to human papillomavirus (HPV). Her research has been funded by NIH, the World Health Organization, foundations, and industry, and has resulted in approximately 200 publications. She has served on a number of national and international committees, including as President of the Society for Adolescent Health and Medicine, as a consultant for the National Academy of Sciences, on the National Vaccine Advisory Committee's HPV Working Group, on the World Health Organization's HPV Vaccine Advisory Committee, and as a subcommittee chair of the International Pediatric Association.
