

## Jennifer Kesselheim, MD, EdM

Dr. Kesselheim's development as an educator grew from endeavors during her medical training to develop novel curricula in ethics, humanism, and professionalism for pediatric residents and pediatric subspecialty fellows. Currently, as an Associate Professor, her clinical practice is in pediatric oncology with a focus on hematologic malignancies. She devotes two thirds of her effort to leadership and scholarship in medical education. Leadership positions (selected) have included founding Director of the Master of Medical Sciences (MMSc) in Medical Education at Harvard Medical School, Fellowship Director for Pediatric Hematology-Oncology, Vice Chair of the Pediatrics Review Committee for the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education, and Co-director of Interprofessional Collaborative Care Curriculum at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Kesselheim's research has been funded by the Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation and the Association of Pediatric Program Directors. Research topics have included ethics, professionalism, and humanism education, diversity in resident and fellow recruitment, entrustable professional activities in pediatrics training, mistreatment in the clinical learning environment, and interprofessional education.
