

## Laurie Steiner, MD Professor of Pediatrics (Neonatology) Lindsey Distinguished Professor for Pediatric Research University of Rochester

Dr. Laurie Steiner completed her undergraduate work at the University of Rochester, graduating Magna Cum Laude with a BS in biochemistry, prior to completing her medical degree at Mount Sinai School of Medicine. She then completed both her pediatric residency and neonatology fellowship at Yale New-Haven Children's Hospital. While at Yale she was also a participant in the Pediatric Scientist Development Program, a national program that selects promising pediatric trainees for intensive research training. Following completion of her training, Dr. Steiner joined the faculty of the University of Rochester, where she is currently Professor of Pediatrics and the Lindsey Distinguished Professor for Pediatric Research. In addition, she serves as the Executive Vice Chair of the Department of Pediatrics. Dr. Steiner is an attending neonatologist, with a particular interest in genetic and hematologic diseases of the neonate. She has developed a robust NIH-funded research program focused on the epigenetic and transcriptional control of normal and diseased erythropoiesis. Work from her laboratory has been published in high profile journals including Cell Reports and Blood, and has been supported by multiple R01 and foundation grants. Dr. Steiner has a keen interest in mentoring, and one of her major career goals is to support the development of the next generation of clinician scientists. In addition to mentoring in her laboratory and the clinic, Dr. Steiner currently serves as the Associate Director of the University of Rochester Medical Training Program, and Chair of the NIDDK-D study section that reviews career development awards.
