2025 JOHN HOWLAND AWARD RECIPIENT



Bonnie W. Ramsey, MD, PhD

Dr. Bonnie W. Ramsey is a Professor Emerita in the Department of Pediatrics, University of Washington School of Medicine, having completed her entire academic career (1980-2022) at UW. She played a key role in the growth of Seattle Children's Research Institute as Director of the Center for Clinical and Translational Research from 2007-2021. She continues to conduct research at the institute's Center for Respiratory Biology and Therapeutics. Dr. Ramsey received her BA from Stanford University, MD from Harvard Medical School, and Pediatrics training at Boston Children's Hospital (R1-2) and Seattle Children's Hospital (R3).

Dr. Ramsey is a pediatric pulmonologist and clinical scientist with over 40 years of experience in translational research and therapeutic development in the field of cystic fibrosis (CF). Her research has not only described the

natural history of lung disease in CF, but established outcome measures, and study designs that led to multiple approved therapies transforming the care of people with CF. She has had consistent NIH and Cystic Fibrosis Foundation (CFF) funding for over four decades and over 200 publications. Her initial focus of research was developing treatments for Pseudomonas aeruginosa (Pa) lung infections. Her work led to the development of inhaled tobramycin (TOBI) as an FDA approved therapy for patients with CF. Dr. Ramsey established the CFF Therapeutics Development Network (CF TDN) which she led from 1998- 2015 and continues to serve as a senior advisor. She has also advised other pediatric subspecialties such as pediatric oncology and rheumatology in development of clinical trials networks. Through the TDN, she was a key leader in the development of multiple CFTR modulators such as the triple combinations elexacaftor/tezacaftor/ivacaftor and vanzacaftor/tezacaftor/deutivacaftor.

Dr. Ramsey has been acknowledged for her contributions to CF and pediatric research through multiple awards including: Paul D' Sant Agnese Award (1998), Lifetime Achievement Award (2013), Richard Talamo Award (2022-renamed the Talamo-Ramsey Award in her honor), CF Legacy Award (2024) from the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Thoracic Society (2014), elected to the American Pediatric Society in 2000, National Academy of Medicine (2015), and received the Warren Alpert Foundation Prize and Society for Pediatric Research Douglas K Richardson Award (2018). Since becoming Professor Emerita of Pediatrics at the UW, in January 2023, she serves as senior consultant for the NIDDK supported Cystic Fibrosis Research and Translation Center and for the NCATS supported Clinical Translational Science Award (CTSA) at the University of Washington. Dr. Ramsey served as Vice Chair for Research in the Department of Pediatrics (1998-2022). There she was a dedicated teacher and mentor to a generation of pediatric residents, fellows and junior faculty in both the conduct of clinical and translational science and career guidance. In addition, she participated in the 2022 APS/SPR Journeys & Frontiers Program where she mentored eight junior faculty from underrepresented minority backgrounds. She continues to serve on the faculty for the CFF Clinical Research Scholars Program focused on developing future academic leaders in the field of CF. In addition to her academic work, Dr Ramsey was a devoted clinician caring for children with CF and other pulmonary disorders for four decades.
